Description:

Abstracts submitted under the Research in Cancer Education category include research projects pertaining to cancer education at any point throughout the cancer continuum. Abstracts may refer to a variety of educational opportunities including: programs, services, staffing changes, resources, and others. Share cancer education research projects that add to evidence based practice and improve the cancer experience.

Review Criteria

Submitted work in the Research in Cancer Education category will be reviewed based on the following guidelines:

1. Background/Purpose
 - Clearly outlines the research question and its significance related to the ICEC conference theme: “Promoting Cancer Education, Equity, and Precision Medicine Globally”
 - Provides a clear purpose statement for the research.
 - Provides background information that led to the research project.
2. Methods
 - Offers a clear description of the research methodology.
3. Results/Findings
 - Clearly states research findings and outcomes.
4. Discussion
 - Offers a clear description of what the research findings mean and how these findings can be applied to real-life settings.
 - Delineates opportunities for future research based on the study findings.
 - Offers a brief description of study limitations inherent to the research methods.
 - Summarizes what was proposed, discussed, and concluded.

Relevance to Cancer Education/Theme of Conference

- Research in Cancer Education is the generation of new knowledge in cancer education.
- There is an aspect to the research relevant to addressing inequities in cancer education across populations globally. Research pertaining to precision medicine in this context is of interest.
- Results make a difference or have an impact on the global cancer community.
