



Please mention the International Cancer Education Conference in order to reserve your room at the conference rate. Room rate includes internet in the guest room and in the meeting space. Rooms are subject to availability, and reservations must be made by **19 August 2016**.

Air Travel

There are two primary airports serving the Washington, DC area:

- Dulles International Airport (IAD): IAD is located west of Washington, DC. There is an Express bus service that can take you to the Wiehle-Reston East Metro Station on the silver line for \$5 per person; the Metro ride from there to Bethesda is approximately 1 hour, costs \$3.60, and requires just one change of trains (at Metro Center, from the silver line to the red line). You may also, of course, take a taxi (about 35 minutes and \$75) or use the shuttle service detailed below.
- Reagan National Airport (DCA): DCA is located south of Washington, DC and has a Metro stop built into the airport. The Metro ride from DCA to Bethesda is approximately 45 minutes, costs \$3.60, and requires just one change of trains (at Gallery Place, from the yellow line to the red). You may also, of course, take a taxi (about 40 minutes and \$60) or use the shuttle service detailed below.

You also have the option to fly into Baltimore/Washington International Thurgood Marshall Airport (BWI), which sometimes has inexpensive airfares, but travel from BWI to Bethesda is best done via taxi (approximately 45 minutes and \$95) or shuttle.

Shuttle Information

The conference organizers have made arrangements for a discounted rate from SuperShuttle if you use their service for transportation between the conference hotel and the airports mentioned above (IAC, DCA, or BWI). The discount is \$1 off of one-way shuttle service or \$3 off of round-trip shuttle service, with additional discounts for exclusive van and car services. Make your SuperShuttle reservation online using the discount code UP3V3.

Tour the Washington, DC and Bethesda Areas

The conference will be held at the Hyatt Regency Bethesda, within easy walking distance of the Bethesda Station on the Washington, DC Metro's red line. There are hundreds of interesting sites to visit while you are in the area, including the many DC monuments and memorials, the Smithsonian Museums, the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum, International Spy Museum, Newseum, and National Zoo. If staying close by, the conference hotel is in walking distance of downtown Bethesda and all it has to offer, among many restuaurants.
